## Only God Can Enable Our Seeking

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We must not yearn after, seek, or desire God so vigorously that it becomes but difficult work and deprives us of rest, and peace, and joy.

One day God shook me with the recollection that it is "not that we are sufficient of ourselves to think anything as of ourselves; but our sufficiency is of God." (II Corinthians 3:5)

If we set out to seek for God, long for Him, yearn after Him in self-dependence, we can only fail. We will ultimately decide that "it didn't work." And indeed it didn't, we didn't, for we can't ever work a spiritual work successfully on our own . . . Nor, for that matter in actuality, can we do any work with maximum success apart from God. And what fools we are ever to try. Yet we do, and we do, and we do!!

We can only allow God to work in us. And even that He must from the first initiate and enable. If it's a good thing, it is always He Who does the work in us from the beginning and throughout. It is always He Who initiates, enables, empowers. To the extent to which we refuse to allow Him so to do, to that extent our efforts are failures.

Our dependence must be always on Him in all things.
